



# KINGSWAY SOLAR COMMUNITY ACTION Walk. Record. Protect.

Last month, we launched our **Step into Nature** campaign to stand up to Kingsway Solar's plans. In March, we asked you to **spot hares** to help protect their habitat.

This April, we're asking you to do the same—but also to listen for skylarks. These threatened birds nest in our fields, and we need to show how much they depend on farmland to survive.

Scientists from the RSPB and the University of Cambridge recently found that small-scale solar farms supported more farmland bird species and a higher bird abundance than arable farmland when managed with mixed habitats.

However, while woodpigeons favoured solar farms, skylarks were more common on arable land. This isn't surprising, as skylarks need long, open sightlines—something solar farms can't provide.

You can record your sightings on iRecord, which allows us to gather data within a 2km area around the proposed solar farm. You can also use the Merlin app to help identify skylarks by their song. Use the Merlin app to identify skylarks and take a screenshot. Then, upload it when recording your sighting on iRecord.

Every sighting counts. Let's join forces to protect our farmland!

#### Working towards a better, greener solution

MPs are currently discussing large-scale solar farms. In March, KSCA attended a roundtable meeting at the Houses of Parliament to discuss how to present our case, alongside many other campaign groups. This meeting was valuable for networking and sharing insights from other campaigns.

#### CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

Here is some safety information to publish in your next magazine. Please feel free to get in touch if you need any further information.

Stay fire safe in your kitchen

More than half the fires our crews attend in the home start in the kitchen. This can be down to a number of things.

Below are some simple safety tips to help you stay fire safe in the kitchen:

Cooking safely

- Avoid leaving children in the kitchen alone when cooking on the hob. Keep matches and saucepan handles out of their reach to keep them safe.
- Take care if you're wearing loose clothing this can easily catch fire.
- Keep tea towels and cloths away from the cooker and hob.
- Double check the cooker is off when you've finished cooking.
- Take care if you need to leave the kitchen whilst cooking, take pans off the heat or turn them down to avoid risk.
- Make sure saucepan handles don't stick out so they don't get knocked off the stove.

- Keep electrics (leads and appliances) away from water.
- Check toasters are clean and placed away from curtains and kitchen rolls.
- Keep the oven, hob and grill clean and in good working order. A build-up of fat and grease can ignite a fire.

Don't let a garden spring clean lead to fire Staying safe outside is just as important as keeping your family safe from fire in your home.

As the Spring time weather (hopefully) begins to arrive, many will take the opportunity to get out in the garden and give it a tidy.

There are a few simple things to do which will help reduce the risk of having a fire:

- Dispose of garden waste using either a local waste pick up service, or take it to a local recycling centre. Do not light a bonfire!
- Ensure cigarettes are completely out
- Do not leave glass bottles lying on the ground the sun's rays reflect through the glass and can start a fire

If you are planning to have a BBQ:

- Use barbeques on a hard, flat surface away from grass, shrubs or fencing
- Put disposable barbeques on bricks, do not place directly on grass

#### LINTON VILLAGE COLLEGE NEWS

To celebrate Science Week, LVC holds a week-long series of events that are designed to inspire and engage our students. Science week has been a long-standing occurrence in the school's calendar.

British Science Week is a 10-day celebration of science and innovation and is an initiative run by the British Science Association. The BSA believes that its remit is to continue to invest in and position the UK as a leader in undertaking research and development in a way that benefits all of society.

Events that took place during LVC's Science Week in March included dissections, 'Shock and Awe' chemistry, a forensic investigation, a Science Fayre, a dance/science collaboration and a trip to Sizewell B Power Station. There were also a series of assemblies

aimed at inspiring students to think about how they might change the world and how science can have an impact on that change.

Alongside this, we entered eight of our top Mathematicians in Year 10 into the Cambridgeshire Maths Feast, hosted at LVC. The event comprised problem solving, geometry and algebra. Out of twenty-one teams from twelve schools across Cambridgeshire, LVC was placed 8th and 10th.

We are enormously proud of our students and their curiosity and academic rigour. As our school is on the doorstep to Cambridge, a city brimming with scientific innovators, pioneers and thought leaders, we continue to inspire the next generation of scientists and STEM industry personnel.

#### DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORT

#### **Bottisham Ward**

Full Council 25 February 2025

Unfortunately, one of the members of the Lib Dem & Independent was unable to be present as his wife had to be taken to hospital after breaking her wrist, and so the effect of the parity of political groups at the Council was not tested,

- 1. In view of the impending Local Government Reorganisation, it was resolved to cease work on the Local Plan (that sets out the development envelopes and planning guidelines for the District) since the new Unitary authority would revise this anyway.
- 2. It was decided that the District Council Tax for 2025/26 would be the same as the last twelve years; this was supported by both sides of the chamber. The Lib Dem & Independent group proposed a budget that: increased funding for tourism and the arts to boost the local economy, increased the Council's actions on climate and the environment, used funding from the abandoned Local Plan review to prepare for proper parking enforcement across East Cambridgeshire which is sadly lacking. This budget was defeated.
- 3. Later in the meeting, however, when the allocation of CIL money was the agenda item, Conservative councillors voted to block a further amendment from the Liberal Democrat & Independent Group from being debated. This amendment would have ceased spending on the Conservatives' very expensive and unwanted crematorium at Mepal.

An Extraordinary Council Meeting is to be held on 20 March to debate the response from this Council on the Local Government Reorganisation proposal.

The next ward surgery will be at the Bottisham Sports and Social Club, Downing Close, CB25 9DD, from half past six to half past seven on Tuesday 22 April 2025, followed by a social meeting at The Bell in the same village.

### EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL-Woodditton Ward

#### CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL REPORTS

#### Council Reorganisation

Further to my comments last month, there has been a lot of work undertaken by the political leaders and Chief executives of the District Councils and County Council together with Peterborough City Council.

All Councils are holding meetings in the week beginning 17<sup>th</sup> March, with the County Council meeting on 18<sup>th</sup> March and East Cambridgeshire District Council (ECDC) meeting on 20<sup>th</sup> March.

Government has asked that Councils submit a response to the proposals by 21<sup>st</sup> March. The councils, excluding Fenland have drafted a letter to respond to Government, the contents of which are very much a holding response.

In the likelihood that the sending of this letter of all of the constituent councils is agreed, then work will continue on the proposals, with Government requiring a final response by 28<sup>th</sup> November.

It is very disappointing that the Government are imposing Local Government reorganisation with no public consultation. Councillors are representatives of residents and to that end, ECDC have circulated a survey to pick up residents' comments on the proposals.

ECDC have frozen their portion of the Council Tax for the twelfth year running and are debt free unlike a number of other councils within Cambridgeshire, so our responsible financial management could be undone. There is no ability within this reorganisation to look at the County boundary issues that we face in this part of the County. A massive opportunity missed.

#### Highways & Transport

At a meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> March, the capital highways maintenance for 2025/2026 was confirmed by the ruling administration. It is based on a scoring matrix that does not favour the rural areas. I will continue to push for better funding for our roads.

Having worked hard with County Council officers and the Parish Council, I am delighted that the measures recommended by the Road Safety team at the High Street/ Six Mile Bottom Road junction in Brinkley are nearing implementation, which I hope will be a positive step to improve the safety at that junction.

The A1303/ Swaffham Heath Road crossroads appears to be working well and having worked hard with County officers to get this implemented, the improvements in safety are currently very satisfying. I am aware of only one accident at the junction since the new layout, but we must not be complacent.

#### Anglesey Abbey Traffic & Parking

Those residents who visited Anglesey Abbey over the weekend of 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> March, may be aware of parking issues that caused problems for residents.

I have held two meetings with County officers and Anglesey Abbey to improve the situation for residents, whilst ensuring that Anglesey Abbey provided a good experience for residents.

I will continue to work to ensure that the issues are resolved for the benefit of everyone.

I hope that the issues did not inconvenience any residents.

#### Kingsway Solar

I took the opportunity, as one of the local members affected by the development, to express my concerns over the development at the recent Environment Committee of the County Council. I was the only one to take the opportunity to express my concerns on behalf of residents. I will continue to oppose what is a development in totally the wrong place. The next stage is a statutory consultation to be held this summer. I will update once more details are known.

I am here to represent you, so if there are any issues that concern you, please contact me.

If I am not aware of an issue, I am not able to solve it


