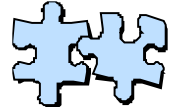

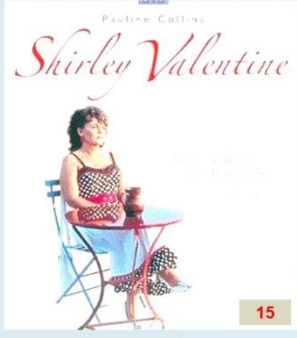

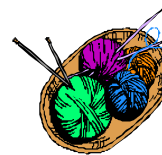

MARSH MAIL - News from Linton Village College

Students from LVC have showcased outstanding artistic talent both at home and abroad this July, celebrating a remarkable summer of achievement through music and dance.

Thirty musicians and singers from Years 7-11 recently embarked on a concert tour of Belgium as members of the Linton Symphonic Wind Orchestra and Linton Voices Choir. Following more than 30 hours of rehearsal, students performed in De Panne and Ostend. The programme featured classical, popular and film music alongside an original choral composition by Mia in Year 11.

Closer to home, LVC students took part in *Voices of Hope and Compassion* at the Cambridge Corn Exchange, a concert celebrating the 80th birthday of acclaimed poet and author Michael Rosen while highlighting the experiences of refugees. Lower and Upper School Dance Companies created and performed a moving piece inspired by one of Rosen's poems, reflecting on the tragic story of two of his relatives during the Second World War. The performance was enhanced by an original composition written and performed by Year 11 student Mia, which received considerable praise from Michael Rosen



Dance students have also been sharing their skills with younger pupils. During the Year 6 induction day, Year 7 performed a dance showcase for incoming students,

while five Year 8 dancers led a workshop for Year 5 pupils at Linton Heights as part of Creativity Week. The school would like to thank Mrs Jukes, Head of Music, and Mrs Frost, Head of Dance, for their hard work and commitment in making these experiences possible.

KINGSWAY CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Kingsway expected back soon

While the application was withdrawn in July, Kingsway Solar has indicated that it intends to revise and resubmit its planning application as soon as possible. So, although we've had a brief pause, the campaign is far from over. We expect a new application sooner rather than later, making it more important than ever that everyone stays informed and is ready for the next stage.

Why was the application withdrawn?

The Planning Inspectorate published a detailed letter explaining why the application wasn't ready to proceed. Its concerns included:

- Missing wildlife and environmental surveys
- Outstanding issues relating to archaeology and heritage
- Missing information and inconsistencies within the application documents
- Concerns that local people had not been given enough information to properly understand the proposals and comment on them
- Doubts that the application contained enough information for the examination to be completed within the statutory timetable

As Kingsway prepares a revised application, we believe these issues must be fully addressed. If a developer cuts corners when preparing an application, it does not inspire confidence that a project of this scale will be planned, built and managed to the high standards needed to protect wildlife, the environment and our villages.

It can be difficult to visualise the scale of a 500MW solar farm from the numbers alone. That's why our 'Did You Know?' campaign is sharing comparisons that help bring the proposal to life.

Kingsway Solar Farm would be around 20 times larger than the existing Wilbraham Solar Farm.

The proposed solar panels would stand up to 4.2 metres high—about the height of a Cambridge Park & Ride bus.

NEWS FROM CHARLOTTE CANE MP

On 4 July 2026, I marked two years since being elected as your Member of Parliament. It remains a huge privilege to represent the constituency of Ely and East Cambridgeshire, and I continue working hard to stay visible, accessible and focused on the issues that matter locally.

Since my election, I have closed more than 17,500 cases where constituents have come to me for help, advice or information. Housing remains the most common concern, followed by roads and support for children with special educational needs and disabilities. I have also helped residents with NHS services, buses, planning, HMRC and visa applications.

I have now held 55 surgeries across the constituency and seven community meetings, giving residents the chance to speak to me directly. My recent meeting in Bottisham was particularly well attended, with lively discussions on bus services, council tax, school funding, gambling and the horseracing industry. Thank you to everyone who came along and shared their views. My next community meeting will take place in Ely in the autumn.

In Parliament, I have spoken in debates and pressed the Government on your behalf, both in person and in writing, about issues affecting our communities. These have included limited access to local NHS services, such as dentistry and GP appointments, the need for fairer funding for Cambridgeshire's roads, the urgent need to improve SEND provision, the protection of our chalk streams, and safety concerns surrounding battery energy storage systems associated with solar farms.

I have also met ministers directly to raise a wide range of local concerns. In one case, I arranged for a constituent to meet a minister in person to discuss the urgent need to remove asbestos from public buildings. Alongside this work, I have continued to speak up for the farmers who produce the food we need and the local businesses that create jobs and drive our economy forward.

Better connectivity remains another major priority. Too many residents still struggle with poor mobile signal, unreliable broadband and public transport that does not meet the needs of our rural communities. I will continue pressing for the investment and improvements our area deserves.

Although Parliament is entering its summer recess, my local work continues. I will be meeting residents, businesses, charities and community organisations throughout the summer. Staying in regular contact with local people ensures that their experiences and priorities shape how I represent our area in Westminster.

DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORTS

Bottisham Ward

Two committee meetings were held this past month.

Operational Services on 22nd June

- Community Safety Partnership report was presented and noted
- Budget report for the previous financial year showed an underspend of £476,084 for the year, but some of this was due to bills not yet paid. The capital spend was also under budget by £5,572,775, but some expenditure was not yet billed.
- Register of Buildings of Local Interest, for buildings or neighbourhoods that were interesting but

not meriting a National Grade, was presented and noted.

- Performance Report for the Waste and Street Cleansing Services showed marginal improvement in performance.
- A report on the new waste bin strategy was presented and it showed that the service had been delivered quite well, with a few teething problems.
- The Long Term Empty Homes Strategy was debated, and it was agreed that it should be forwarded to Full Council.

Finance and Assets on 25th June

- The Climate and Nature Monitoring Report was presented and accepted.
- A grant of up to £100,000 from the Community Infrastructure Levy funding was allocated to the Viva Arts and Community Group Theatre in Soham towards the expansion of the theatre to enable larger youth participation and provide enhanced and inclusive welfare and safeguarding spaces to continue to operate with full compliance with the Children in Entertainment Regulations.
- A new fee for Planning was introduced to give some limited time to give guidance on possible applications without the formality of a pre-app or full application.
- Progress on the Mepal Crematorium was presented and noted.
- The Council's Proposed Business Grant Scheme for capital grants to small businesses was approved. Further information is available from: *Business Grant Scheme 2026 to 2027 | East Cambridgeshire District Council*
- This Committee has a year-end underspend of £1,331,912 when compared to its approved revenue budget of £7,969,054. Most of this was due to savings on staff salaries because of staff not being replaced immediately.

#### Waste Services

#### Highways

If you believe there is a pothole or road defect that requires work, please contact me and I will raise this with highways.

#### Council Reorganisation

Government have made an announcement on the Local Government reorganisation for Cambridgeshire and have postponed any decision until October. This is a scandalous decision, as it puts at risk the smooth transfer from existing councils to the new proposals, as the timescale is already very tight and delay, without any indication of what the new format is likely to be, is totally unacceptable. Based on other counties, that have had their reorganisations announced, such as Norfolk and Suffolk, the new councils have favoured urban areas, but expanded out into rural areas, thus maximising the Government's local council electoral influence.

This gives me grave concerns at an outcome, that could have East Cambridgeshire as the building site for an expanded Cambridge. I will continue to push for the best outcome for residents, but as you will be aware, the decision is that of Government, with a new Secretary of State in place, so we are at their mercy.

#### The Ellesmere Centre Post Office

I explained in the likely outcome for the Post Office is one of a community Post Office. The work on achieving this continues, and as I mentioned last month, this requires a considerable amount of work for the working group of trustees of the Centre. Trustees are working on how we can strengthen the governance of the trustees going forward, as we enter into a commercial arrangement for running the Post Office.

This will involve significant legal expenses, which the Trustees are searching for funding avenues to offset some of these costs.

#### Forest City

No new update on this.

#### Kingsway Solar

As I mentioned last month, the application for proposed solar farm that would have covered 3,700 acres around Weston Colville and West Wrattling has been withdrawn. However, I do not believe that this has gone away. I will update accordingly in the coming months.

Please contact me if there is any issue concerning you. I have not done surgeries previously, because I am able to visit residents or meet them, wherever is suitable for them, rather than making residents come to me. I am available to all.
