Once you have 'signed up,' your name is printed inside the card. The card is delivered to everyone in our village.





DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORTS

EAST CAMBS - Bottisham Ward Charlotte Cane & John Trapp TRANSPORT

The Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) has launched two public consultations on proposals for transport links in and around Cambridge. Some of these proposals have significant implications for our routes into Cambridge, especially along the Newmarket Road.

The Making Connections consultation closes on 20 December and more information can be found at www.greatercambridge.org.uk/making-connections-2021

The Cambridge Eastern Access consultation closes on 22 December and more information can be found at www.greatercambridge.org.uk/NewmarketRd2021 They will be hosting events online throughout the consultation period, and these will be advertised on

As you may be aware, there is a local group, the AtoB 1102, who are looking at the implications of these proposals for our area. To find out more about them, register your views and see their campaigns, please see their website at https://atob1102.org/. The proposed changes are significant for our area. For some reason, East Cambs is not part of the GCP - so we need to make our voices heard by responding directly to the GCP consultations and working with the AtoB 1102 group.

An electric bicycle ride took place in October to mark the works currently ongoing to install the flagship heat network in Swaffham Prior to get the community off oil and onto renewable energy. The event included a tour of the site where the energy centre is being built for the project. The media took interviews which reached as far as Japan.

SUNICA SOLAR FARM PLANS

Last month the Chair of the County Council's Environment and Green Investment Committee was taken on a tour round part of the area proposed by Sunnica for their colossal (and controversial) commercial solar farm and battery storage stretching for miles across the East Cambridgeshire and West Suffolk countryside east of Burwell. Cambridgeshire County Council has already expressed its concern to the Secretary of State about the scale of what is proposed. The tour began at The Ark Church in Isleham, then took in Freckenham, Red Lodge, Kennett, La Hogue, and Chippenham—and that was just part of this massive proposal. They saw some of the fantastic views, working farms, stud farms and other parts of this wonderful area which will be hugely affected if the Planning Inspectorate approves the plans. Council officers are expecting that Sunnica will submit their planning application to the Secretary of State on Friday 12 November. The application will be determined by the Planning Inspectorate, not by the District or County Council. You can follow the progress of the application and register your interest at https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/p rojects/eastern/sunnica-energy-farm/ applications for more solar farms continue to come forward in our area and yet there is still no strategic overview for alternative energy sites in East Cambs each application is considered in isolation with no thought for the cumulative impact or the necessary infrastructure. We will continue to call for this strategic overview so that we get the right balance between green electricity generation, farming and open space.

We do hope that you will get a good break this Christmas and the chance to meet with family and friends.

NEWS FROM LUCY FRASER

As 2021 draws to an end I wanted to let you know a few things that I have been doing since the summer.

I have been proud to recognise those in our communities that have gone above and beyond to help others throughout the pandemic: collecting medication and groceries, to looking out for elderly neighbours or volunteering for local causes. I am pleased to have recognised work this hard through Cambridgeshire COVID Community Champions Awards that I have organised, spotlighting these stories of selfless acts. I will shortly be announcing the winners and holding a special event in Parliament to recognise the hard work of nominees. Their stories will be shared on my website and social media as well as with the local community.

I have recently been working with Burrough Green Parish Council to try and address concerns about speeding and road safety in Burrough Green and have organised meetings with both the police and the Local Highways Authority to discuss the issues. Following these meetings, the police visited Burrough Green to carry out speed checks, catching one vehicle travelling at 46mph in the 30mph zone, and have agreed to visit again in the near future. In addition, I have supported the Parish Council's bid for funding to reduce the speed limit on the Burrough End section of the B1052 from the current national speed limit to 30mph with a 40mph buffer zone.

We've had an incredible autumn for the colours of leaves and leaves staying on trees; one of the best that I can remember. The mild weather, as I understand, has contributed towards this; we have neither had the frosts nor the strong winds which would tend to strip the branches bare. Having said that - there still seem to be plenty of leaves on the ground - but still plenty on the trees. By the time you read this though this will all have changed.

My morning walk today took me along Devil's Dyke, between Woodditton and Stetchworth. There's one particular place where, on a clear day, you can see Ely Cathedral. Today, being beautifully clear (and also quite cold - maybe the leaf fall will start in earnest soon) that incredible and inspiring building was standing out on the horizon. For generations that building has provided inspiration to those living for miles around, signposting not only itself, but the way of the Cross.

As I write we are approaching the season of Advent, the time when we ask (both literally and metaphorically) whether we are ready for Christmas. Ready not only in the preparations for the feast, but ready in terms of the welcome that we are preparing for the Christ child. Yet my letter to you, being written for December and January covers not only the Church season of Advent (the "New Year" to the Church) and the Christmas season itself but also the festival of the Epiphany and the beginning of what we also call "Ordinary Time" between Epiphany and Lent. Just as our beloved Cathedral signposts the way of the Cross, so do our Christian seasons. And although our changing seasons tell us time is passing (sometimes all too quickly) they too can remind us of the things that are important to us that remain constant.

Hopefully we will be able to celebrate Christmas in our Churches this year. The different services across our benefice are shown here in this newsletter and as always you will be very welcome to join.

On behalf of all involved with ministry here and all our PCCs I wish you a very merry Christmas and a happy and blessed 2022.
