

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

John Trapp East Cambs, Bottisham Ward Unfortunately the strategy of ECDC Council that it would hold Zoom meetings as in the previous year, and that the results of any voting on motions or resolutions would advise the Chief Executive was deemed illegal. The Planning Committee met at the Hive, but unfortunately there was no livestreaming. Other Committees are meeting at the Grange, with very restricted access for the public.

Using Zoom, John attended the Better Public Transport - Cambridge Eastern Access Project: to note the recommendation that Phase A on-line improvements to Newmarket Road should be advanced to OBC stage, with a longer term Phase B plan to develop a high quality public transport route connecting Coldhams Lane and a relocated Park and Ride site on Newmarket Road to be developed further if the draft Greater Cambridge Local Plan indicates that the Marshalls site will be allocated for development and land made available; presumption of access via Coldhams Lane rather than the Tins, and potential improvement to the Coldhams Lane roundabout; also potential for reallocation of roadspace on Newmarket Road and Coldhams Lane, and to improve the Cambridge to Newmarket Line in the longer term, with twin-tracking and additional stations—GCP should support EWR Consortium and Network Rail in maximising the potential benefits of this asset

Regrettably the Administration is not engaging with GCP to any great extent, although almost half the District will be affected by these proposals, even more so when the GCP considers the Northern Access. Our next Councillors' Surgery and meet your Councillors will be on Wednesday 21 July at 6.30 p.m. This will be held by Zoom - Meeting ID: 865 7631 8040, Passcode: 490667. REPORT FROM LUCY FRASER MP FOR SOUTH EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE

I know this year has been very tough for so many people. But it has been great to see how our local communities have pulled together to help those in need.

After an immensely successful vaccine rollout we are slowly able to see life return to normal. We have seen that effective vaccines are a vital part of ending the COVID-19 pandemic. Through vaccination, we can stop those most at risk from getting the virus, reduce hospitalisations and see fewer deaths. The vaccine rollout, which is the largest inoculation programme this country has ever launched, has been a truly remarkable achievement.

By the end of May, a total of 129,251 doses had been administered in South East Cambridgeshire and national estimates indicated that the vaccination programme had already averted over 39,000 hospitalisations and over 13,000 deaths in older adults. There is also now evidence that vaccines are effective at protecting against infection and transmission, which is especially promising as we look to the future. I know how extremely grateful the local community is to all those involved in this inspiring collective effort.

Like many people, much of my time has been spent dealing with the virus and its impacts but I have also managed to ensure that work continues with local organisations on local issues.

And I wanted to let you know specifically about an issue I have been dealing with in Westley Waterless. A number of constituents contacted me in 2020 to report concerns about longstanding problems with water pressure in their homes. I met virtually with Anglian Water who accepted that there had been problems for a while and that they would install a temporary overland pipe to supply the village and that, if this resolved the problem, they would make it a permanent solution. The temporary pipe was installed in June 2020 and constituents reported that things were much better. In April 2021, Anglian Water installed 3.5km of new pipes to serve Westley Waterless and Dullingham and a booster pump at Woodditton Water Tower. I am now assured that the water pressure and flow in both villages is now significantly improved.

On a more regional level I am also delighted that last month the government announced further school funding for our area - with an extension of the Fenland and East Cambridgeshire Opportunity Area. The additional £1,158,500 of funding is on top of the additional COVID funding which is being provided across the country. I pressed hard for our area to become an opportunity area. Funding over the last 5 years has helped, amongst other things, to fund mental health training for 1200 school staff, with over 90% of participants reporting increased confidence in their ability to identify the early signs of mental ill health and offer support to those that need it. 45 mental health leads have been established, with 1,300 parents and carers accessing support.

Our seasons and holidays are defined for us by school calendars, sports seasons, tax schedules, the greeting card industry, our national celebrations, and the liturgical calendar. Some days stand out as sacred because of our memories and associations—birthdays, anniversaries, memories of personal triumph or tragedy.

At the moment my days seem defined by the number of times the grass needs cutting and the number of weeds that appear daily! This, I am aware, is prompted by the recent rainfall, following those glorious days of sunshine. Yet, how wonderfully green everything looks and reminds me that many gardeners believe that 'green is the colour of life'.

In our church or liturgical calendar, we have entered a season of green, when the fabrics in our churches are changed to green for the period known as Ordinary Time. It is the long period from Pentecost until we start another liturgical year at the end of November with the season of Advent. Most of us live ordinary lives with ordinary days in which we know our best and our worst self and everything in-between. We have our days when, with a bounce in our step, we are able to bring joy, patience, and gratitude to others, and days when we need hope, trust, and a forgiving heart to put one foot in front of the other.

So, what are some ways we can make the most of Ordinary Time? "Ordinary" comes from the word, "Order." Perhaps we may try to bring some order into our lives, to set time for quiet reflection amidst the priorities and schedules of our day.

Ordinary Time is a great time to learn to pray or to read the daily readings, (there are many free Apps to help you, POTM - Prayers on the Move or Daily Prayer for example). It's a good time to get in the habit of valuing time by stopping, or at least pausing, in our day, even for a moment. Whether we sit, or lie down, or are talking to our children, whether we are in our house, driving our car, doing the shopping or at work, when we are sitting with friends, or going for a walk, we can try always to be remembering the nearness of God.

In our continuing uncertain times, whether you will be taking a holiday away from home or enjoying some rest at home, it is good to remember to look around and notice how beautiful God is, and how He is everywhere represented and speaking to us. Let's hope we have some glorious weather over the summer. Have fun and keep safe.
