**MARSH MAIL News from Linton Village College**

It has been fantastic to observe the College grounds alive once again with the sights and sounds of grassroots sport. Welcoming back community groups onto site has marked the start of our re-emergence from lock down restrictions. Our Sports Centre has also reopened its indoor facilities and looks forward to even more members supporting this village resource over the coming months.

Within the College, students have benefited from a broader educational experience this term. Our Year 7 and 8 students have moved into new learning bases and all year groups have access to more specialist teaching rooms and practical lessons. A number of extracurricular clubs have also restarted.

A healthy lifestyle is also supported by positive mental health. We have been particularly conscious of our Year 11 cohort and how to ensure that the process of awarding GCSE grades this summer takes account of their wellbeing as well as achieving optimum academic outcomes. At LVC we have designed a schedule of assessment, in line with the government guidance and exam board requirements, that gives students the best opportunity to achieve their potential.

During the first half of the summer term, students will be completing a range of slimmed down assessment tasks within their lessons. We have sought to avoid replicating the pressurised conditions of the exam series that has been cancelled.

I have been incredibly impressed with how maturely students have responded to the significant disruption to their education. I have been equally impressed by the hard work and commitment of teachers and support staff. Having adjusted to the requirements of teaching and learning in the Covid-19 contexts and the challenges that this has presented, students and staff are now adapting to the requirements of a teacher-led assessment process.

It is no surprise that the global pandemic has led to a surge in the number of applications for teacher training. While some of this may have been motivated by the job security associated with the profession, the privilege, job satisfaction and sense of reward that comes from supporting young people in their education has been highlighted in the current context.

**DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORTS**

**East Cambridgeshire District Council Update**

*Bottisham Ward : Charlotte Cane & John Trapp*

The Council has decided to demolish the buildings, including the tent, at the Mepal Outdoor Centre. John and Charlotte, amongst others, were shocked that the buildings had been allowed to fall into such disrepair and that insurance money received had not been spent on repairing the buildings. There was no consideration given to alternative options other than to keep the buildings in their current state. Nor was there any consideration of the impact of demolition on the wildlife at the site and how to mitigate disturbance. An application to demolish will now be made through the planning system. This was particularly ironic, as the Operational Services Committee earlier in the month had approved a Youth Strategy and Action Plan. One of the big concerns which came from the Youth survey was space for recreation and outdoor activities.

It was unanimously agreed to carry over funds which would have gone to community sports centres in 2020-21 in order to provide financial assistance as they come out of Covid restrictions. It was also unanimously agreed to allocate CIL funding to improvements at the Gardiner Memorial Hall in Burwell.

Because of Covid restrictions, government allowed Councils to meet by video link rather than in person. This has proved to have many benefits, but the government have refused all-party requests from the Local Government Association and the National Association of Local Councils to extend the current arrangements beyond early May. East Cambs meetings have seen hundreds of people logging on during and after meetings to view on-line proceedings. This is much higher numbers than can attend meetings in person. Journeys to and from Ely for meetings have been cut, saving the Council money and saving environmental degradation. People with caring responsibilities have been able to join meetings, and be at home if they are needed. Conversely, people with poor broadband or who are not familiar with the technology have felt excluded. The Government is now consulting on on-line meetings. If you would like to give your view, the consultation is now online at <https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/local-authority-remote-meetings-call-for-evidence>. The consultation ends on 17 June 2021.

**REVnd NIKKI MANN**

I remember in the past staring at a blank screen and wondering where inspiration would come from to write something for our parish newsletters. I also remember being rather grateful that the particular deadline of getting a letter ready was no longer a deadline on me. It's always a particular challenge in that what you write will actually not be read for at least two weeks and actually wants to be meaningful for a month after that.

I didn't expect to be doing this again any time soon.

I know how much the Revd. Nikki's death came as a shock for us all. I have had so many conversations which have started "I just can't believe it". Nikki meant so much to so many people - not just those of her faith, but those of any faith and those of no faith. Those of us that share Nikki's deeply held faith at least have confidence of her rising in glory as one of those who, in the words we often use at Christmas Eve, rejoice with us, but upon another shore and in a greater light, that multitude which no man can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, and with whom, in this Lord Jesus, we for evermore are one. Nikki was maybe a sister to us all, but for her family not only that but also a mum, a wife, a daughter, and a very proud grandma.

As I write this the weather is varying between beautiful spring and frosty winter; we know it will change but it makes for chance to see the beauty around us. Take a moment, if you can, to see what is around, to breathe the air, to listen to the birdsong (increasingly starting earlier in the morning).

The work of the Church goes on; we have had meetings with the Rural Dean to plan the service patterns that we will follow. At least for a while we will continue to follow our normal plan of services, in person unless advice changes, but we will also try to get our "Reflections" emailed to those that would like them when we can (although it will not be every week).
