UPDATE FROM BURROUGH GREEN PARISH COUNCIL

Thank you to the residents who joined our September meeting.

Here are the highlights and recent updates:

Speeding - We're very pleased to let you know that our LHI (Local Highway Improvement) application for two 40 mph 'Buffer zones' on Bradley Road (one at each end of Burrough Green) has been successful. As soon as we have a timetable for the installation, we'll publish the information. By the end of November, we hope to have heard the outcome of our separate application for grant funding towards the cost of installing a dedicated MVAS (Mobile Vehicle Activate Sign) on Brinkley Road in Burrough End.

Village Pond - Two phases of the restoration work are now complete. Trees and overgrowth have been cut back, and the pond has been dredged of debris and sludge. The clay lining has been repaired, which we hope will prevent the pond from drying up during future hot summers, and in-turn allow more wildlife to flourish. Funds allowing, the final phase will look at other things we can do to encourage wildlife, such as installing bat boxes. A special 'thank you' to Peter Read for his help with disposing of the sludge.

Footpaths & Hedges - Now that the growing season is largely over, please can households who have hedges that face onto the public footpaths, ensure that their hedges are cut fully back. It's hugely important that footpaths are kept accessible and safe for all users. Thank you to those who have already done this!

Play Area - Sadly there has been a level of vandalism and equipment misuse recently, with sections of the fence being broken and repairs required to the basket swing. These have been fixed now, but if anyone witnesses damage taking place, or use by children over 12 years old, then please let the Clerk know by emailing clerk@burroughgreenparishcouncil.org.uk, or speak to one of the Councillors.

CAMBRIDGE FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE

Remember, remember to celebrate safely!

Bonfire Night is a very popular fixture in the calendar where people come together to enjoy fireworks. While it can be fun for all of the family to enjoy, there are lots of potential hazards so it's really important to keep you and your family safe. Help support your local community this year and go to an organised firework display instead of holding one at home.

While most people enjoy fireworks responsibly, in the wrong hands they can cause injury and damage to property. Fireworks are explosives and as such should be treated with respect and only used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and the firework safety code.

Also lighting bonfires in back gardens presents significant risks to residents, so would encourage residents across the county to think twice before having their own displays and lighting bonfires.

Firework safety tips

- Only buy fireworks with a CE mark

- Light fireworks at arm's length using a taper, stand well back and never go back to a lit firework

- Never throw fireworks or put them in your pockets or clothing

- Light sparklers one at a time wearing gloves, and place used sparklers in a bucket of water

- Never give sparklers to children under five
- Keep your pets indoors throughout the evening

- It is illegal to sell fireworks to someone under the age of 18 or to light fireworks in a public place

- Respect your neighbours - don't let off fireworks late at night and remember there are laws to follow. Visit our website to see what organised fireworks displays are happening around the county.

Bonfire safety

We would urge people to think twice about having a bonfire.

Lighting a bonfire in a garden presents significant risks to residents if they get out of hand. Not only this, but the smoke can also aggravate neighbours with respiratory problems.

If you do decide to have a bonfire, please follow our top five tips:

- Build your bonfire well clear of buildings, garden sheds, fences and hedges

- Never use flammable liquids to start a bonfire, and --never burn dangerous items such as aerosol cans, paint tins, foam furniture, or batteries

- Don't leave bonfires unattended. An adult should supervise it until it has burnt out. If it has to be left, damp it down with plenty of water

- Always keep a bucket of water or a hosepipe nearby in case of fire

- Check the weather - avoid lighting bonfires in high winds.

EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL/CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL REPORTS

Highways

I continue to wait for details of the new Highways reporting system. It is hoped that this system will be more user friendly than the current system, producing more information for residents, councillors and Highways staff. I have concerns that the new system will be in place for April 2025.

Brinkley Road Junction

Further to the on-site meeting with residents on Friday 6th September, I can confirm that the Parish Council's bid was scored high enough to be accepted as part of the Local Highways Improvement scheme.

I hope that this will bring the much needed safety improvements to the junction near the Red Lion.

Work will hopefully start on this junction in the New Year and I will keep residents updated.

Swaffham Heath Road/ A1303 Crossroads

Work on site commenced on site on 16th September and will continue for an expected 15 weeks.

Buses

There has been a delay in decisions on the extra services that were promised by the Combined Authority (CPCA).

Ongoing discussions with bus companies are currently happening, but it is frustrating that there has been such a delay in taking us to the next stage of the new provision.

Please visit the CPCA website and give your views on this.

Waste

I have previously mentioned about changes to the waste collections.

The Full Council of East Cambridgeshire District agreed to implement the scheme probably from April 2026.

The changes are due for 2026 and involve the introduction of a black bin for general waste instead of black bags and a smaller food caddy for food waste. The blue and green bins will continue to be collected as normal.

These changes are part of Government standardising the way in which waste is collected.

East Cambridgeshire District Council will continue to collect green waste free of charge, unlike some other local councils.

I am here to represent you, so if there are any issues that concern you, please contact me.

If I am not aware of an issue, I am not able to solve it.

DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORT

Operational Services Committee agreed that the Council implements the Waste Collection and Street Cleansing proposals, to wit:

1. collect food waste in a separate container, on a weekly basis by 31 March 2026,

2. the collection of residual waste in a 180lt wheeled bin fortnightly,

3. a free fortnightly garden waste collection service and the possibility of a second garden waste bin for free,

4. fortnightly collection of recycling as at present,

The aim is to increase the re-cycling by residents; we pay for waste taken to the waste depot but receive a

rebate for that which is re-cycled. Exceptions will be made for larger households and those houses that have no storage facilities which will be given coloured bags as for now. Provision has been built into the budget to pay for the extra bins. Comprehensive information will be disseminated to all residents well in advance to help with a smooth transition.

It was also agreed to retain the current street cleansing service specification, and review it in one year's time, and to proceed with using East Cambs Street Scene Ltd (ECSS) even though it was still not performing to target.

Finance & Assets Committee

The following decisions were made at the meeting on Thursday 26 September:

1. introduction of a £70 fine for misdeclaration of Council Tax discounts,

2. Net Zero Villages Grant Scheme was approved; £150,000 to be allocated to villages for improving community premises; applications for up to £30,000 to be sent in by the end of the year,

Council Officers now predict an 'overall 3. increase in costs' for the planned crematorium at Mepal, and an attempt by Liberal Democrats on the committee to refer the cost rises to a Full Council meeting next month was rejected by a block vote of Conservative Councillors; the details of the increased costs were in a confidential report, but the published papers state that the rise is 'largely made up of a gap in the projects contingency budget and an increase in build costs'; the escalating costs for the crematorium, already predicted to cost over £9 million, have substantial implications for the project, and further work is being undertaken and further costs are being incurred without this coming back to the Full Council for consideration of the new information; Charlotte pointed out that the tight timescale and restricted times of year for working on a biodiverse site would also lead to cost increases; John said that changing the scheme to keep it within the budget would not deliver the graceful project the Council had approved. At the forthcoming Council meeting the creation of the new Local Plan (the document that defines where new housing, industrial and recreational buildings can be built within the District) is proposed. Our current Local Plan is almost ten years old, and it must be replaced by an up-to-date version within two years.

The East Cambridgeshire Community Fund will be open to applications between the 28 October to 9 December 2024. The aim of this small community grants scheme is to support local community groups to provide new or develop existing community services and initiatives that improve the quality of life for residents living in East Cambridgeshire. 
