EAST CAMBS DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT Bottisham Ward

John Trapp & Charlotte Cane :

The death of HM Queen Elizabeth II on Thursday 8 September was announced early that evening. Our condolences go to her family at this sad time. The Accession Council met on Saturday 10 September to proclaim the new monarch King Charles III—the first time its meeting has been televised.

Several Council Committee meetings have had to be postponed or cancelled either because the notice for, or the date of, the meeting was within the official mourning period.

Performance for waste collection and street cleansing at East Cambridgeshire District Council has been the lowest since the service was transferred to East Cambs Street Scene (ECSS) in 2018, figures issued to Councillors reveal. The performance of the service was due to be debated at a meeting of the Council's Operational Services Committee on Monday 12 September, but this was cancelled following the death of HM The Queen.

- The Council's target for 'bin deliveries within 10 working days' was 92%—but the Council managed just 38%.
- Similarly, the Council's target for 'overall performance' of the street cleansing service was 90%—but the Council achieved just 21% in the first guarter of the financial year.

Staff shortages, sickness and the recent reconfiguration of waste rounds are being blamed for the performance downturn. Street sweeping services have suffered as drivers have been diverted to the waste collections which was considered a higher priority.

The District Council has requested an extension for deciding the Mepal crematorium application (21/01216/F3M) until 30 September 2022. The reason why an extension of time is being requested has been given as 'to all [sic] for full assessment of the application'.

The Greater Cambridge Partnership has published its plans for transport into Cambridge. The plans include more regular buses, with flat rate fares, paid for through a 'road user charge'. They will be consulting on this in the autumn, and it has significant implications for local residents. For more details see <u>Ambitious</u> <u>proposals to deliver world-class transport network for Greater Cambridge unveiled</u>. The proposed bus services for this area can be found on pages 27-29 at <u>26082022 Making Connections - Bus Proposition</u> <u>Design FINAL.pdf</u>. Fares for buses from here would be a flat rate £2 and inside the current mega rider boundary they would be £1. There would be a daily cap and concessions and free bus passes would remain as current. The road user charge of £5 for cars and motorbikes, more for larger vehicles, will be charged on weekdays 7.00am to 7.00pm. There will be discounts for regular travellers and exemptions for some people, e.g. Blue Badge holders, community transport, buses.

We will be holding a face-to-face surgery on 18 October from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. at Fassage Hall, Lode, and thereafter at The Shed, Lode. In the meantime, residents can contact us by email or phone.

Woodditton Division

Alan Sharp

I am writing this a week after the death of Queen Elizabeth II and thinking about the huge impact that has had upon us all. In my role as Chairman of East Cambridgeshire District Council, I was honoured and humbled to be involved in the proclamation event on Sunday 11th September at Ely Cathedral.

There is always a lull in meetings during the summer and the Children & Young People Committee has not met since 5th July and will not meet again until 11th October. That is far too big a gap to properly scrutinise the workings of the County Council Education department and the ability to challenge decisions of the administration.

The Highways & Transport Committee met on 12th September and one of the agenda items was to recommend to the Strategy & Resources Committee the procurement of a new Asset Management system, which will improve reporting of Transport issues, such as potholes, for residents, as well as giving more information to Parish Councils on issues within their area. I will update the progress of this procurement of future months.

In early August, I had a meeting with County Council officers about the A1303 and improvements that could be made to improve road safety after two fatalities near the Missing Sock during this year. I will continue to pursue all outcomes that can improve road safety. The commencement of works on the Swaffham Heath Road/ A1303 crossroads, which will become a staggered junction, has been delayed due to some land ownership issues and I will continue to push for this necessary safety work to be completed as soon as possible.

Of concern to those residents travelling into Cambridge, the Liberal Democrat and Labour controlled Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) have announced proposals for congestion charging within the Greater Cambridge area, which would include Addenbrookes at a rate of £5. In my opinion, this will unfairly affect those on lower incomes more and the inclusion of the hospital within the charging area will have a huge effect on NHS staff and patients. The GCP are proposing large numbers of buses running to replace private car use, but the GCP has no budget to purchase those vehicles and it is unlikely that the congestion charge would cover the bus running costs and the GCP has no budget to fund the shortfall.

Additionally, the GCP has no plan where all the buses streaming into the City Centre will terminate, as Drummer Street does not have the physical capacity to handle the projected number of buses.

The GCP is an unelected body, and has no representatives from East Cambridgeshire, yet is trying to impose its decisions on East Cambridgeshire residents. I will continue to question the decisions that are being made, which will affect you.

If you want to know more about the proposals, please visit the GCP website. I would welcome any comments, especially on the congestion charging proposals and other transport issues, so that I can convey your concerns.

I am elected to represent residents and I will continue to do that, but if there is anything that concerns you, please contact me and I will try to fix it.

If any resident wants to meet me to discuss any issue, then please feel free to contact me. I want to hear comments from everyone, as that is the only way that I can truly represent you.

Dear Friends,

I have written a few times of the challenges that one faces writing for our newsletters nearly three weeks before they will be first read, and something that will stay relevant for at least seven weeks (and sometimes eleven). I feel this particularly today as I sit in the vestry of St. Peter's Church in Stetchworth almost in vigil for our late Queen, after our Communion service, to greet any visitors to the Church and before I shall lower the Union Flag to half-mast again, to mark the period of mourning following the proclamation of the ascension of our King, Charles III.

In three weeks the period of mourning will have passed. The loss that many of us feel will have eased.

Our flagpoles will look as they normally do. Our new government will have started to work. Many of us will continue to battle with rising prices and uncertainty. It may look like "business as usual". But will it be so?

The example set by our Queen over her long reign has been immense. Her faith, her humility, endeared her to the population. It endeared her not only to those in this country, but to people all over the world. Even in those countries where the monarchy itself has been seen as something that was bad in that country's history, the Queen has been admired for her wise counsel, her interest, and her friendship to all. His Majesty the King, speaking the day after his mother's death, echoed the promise that she had herself made, that he would continue to serve and follow her good example.

So, business as usual? I hope and pray for more than that.

I hope and pray that some of the example, of the Queen, and what we will see of the Nation coming together, will be reflected in us all; whether we be in positions of authority, or whether we just "do what we can". I write this in the early stages of the Nation's mourning, but in confidence that we will see this. In the Gospel of St. John, we read "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends". We can understand this as dedication to a life of service, and understand the Queen's love, having dedicated her life to her country, her friends. In what we can do ourselves, maybe we should all just be a little kinder, and more tolerant, and if we can do this in memory of our Queen, then that legacy will live on.

God save the King!
