ALLOTMENT LAND PURCHASE - BRINKLEY

As you may know the land on which the allotments currently sit in Coles Lane in Brinkley is looking to be sold by the current owners. This is an important and popular amenity in Brinkley and the parish council recognises the need to keep this facility for the community.

The Parish council has been offered to purchase the land at a negotiated cost of £8000. There will also be a cost of £2500 for legal fees associated with the purchase which the Parish council will fund.

Over the last few months the parish council has been looking at different ways in which we could fund the £8000 and we have been lucky enough to have a pledge from a resident which will cover half the cost.

In order to fund the other £4000 the Parish council will be applying for a loan from the Public Works Loan board. This will be repaid over 20 years at a cost of approximately £310 per year. In order to fund the repayments an increased plot fee of £35 pa, has been discussed and agreed with a representative of the current plot holders.

However, despite having historical letting figures as guidance and adding a margin for safety, there is a chance that there could be an unexpected downturn in income on the plots. At this worst case, the Parish Council would first consider and discuss with the plot holders an increase in plot fees and at the last resort, use the Parish Council reserves to cover the shortfall. In no case would the precept be increased, nor would the loan repayments be at risk.

Big Questions / Global Curriculum - BRAND NEW!

At Burrough Green Academy, to supplement our curriculum, the children will now access a global curriculum - this is designed to get to think about those huge issues whether it be access to clean water for all or considering more spiritual questions such as: If you have happiness does there have to be sadness? The question for the whole school this term is WHY DO WE RECYCLE PLASTICS? There is already a display up in our new library (more about that later!) and there will be regular assemblies on the topic during the term. EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL/CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL REPORTS

Highways

The County Council are in the process of procuring a new reporting system for highways issues. It is hoped that this system will be more user friendly than the current system, producing more information for residents, councillors and Highways staff. The new system is due to be in place for April 2025.

Brinkley Road Junction

It was good to meet residents on Friday 6th September at the junction near the Red Lion and update them on the progress that has been made with the bid to the County Council Local Highways Improvement scheme. Having worked with the Parish

Council, it is expected that the proposed scheme will be agreed by the Highways & Transport Committee on 1st October.

I hope that this will start to reduce the accidents that have happened at this junction. I would welcome hearing from residents about this junction.

Mill Road Bridge Cambridge

The consultation undertaken during August and September has been completed. Once the consultation returns have been collated by officers, it is expected that there will be a special meeting of the Highways & Transport Committee to be held on 4th October, to consider the matter.

However, those members of the Committee who took part in the debate on Mill Road bridge in July 2021 or March 2023 will not be allowed to take part, which means that I will not be part of the debate

I still have huge concerns over the proposal, as they seem to have not learned any of the lessons as to why the proposal was so hated, as it does not address the effect on the side streets off Mill Road and no data has been produced to substantiate anything.

Swaffham Heath Road/ A1303 Crossroads

Work on site commenced on site on 16th September and will continue for an expected 15 weeks.

Buses

There has been a delay in decisions on the extra services that were promised by the Combined Authority (CPCA).

Ongoing discussions with bus companies are currently happening, but it is frustrating that there has been such a delay in taking us to the next stage of the new provision.

This provision is being financed by the mayoral precept increase that was imposed, with currently no extra provision planned for this part of the County.

The CPCA consultation on bus franchising continues and runs until November. Please visit the CPCA website and give your views on this. I have concerns about the funding of this and how much will be increased by the mayor as his share of the Council Tax.

Education

I mentioned last month about the County Council (CCC) £14m overspend in 2023/2024 on the scheme that exists for Special Educational Needs Provision.

I raised this issue at the recent Children & Young Peoples Committee, which is the Education Committee, and did not receive any response to having the Internal Audit report discussed at the Committee. I will continue to push that this issue is discussed in public at the next meeting.

I will keep you updated.

Waste

I have previously mentioned about changes to the waste collections.

The changes are due for 2026 and involve the introduction of a black bin for general waste instead of black bags and a smaller food caddy for food waste. The blue and green bins will continue to be collected as normal, with the District Council proposing that the second green bin will be free of charge.

These changes are expected to happen in 2026 and are part of Government standardising the way in which waste is collected.

East Cambridgeshire District Council will continue to collect green waste free of charge, unlike some other local councils.

These changes are expected to happen in 2026, and the District Council are due to vote on these proposals on 17th October, so I will update with further information nearer the time

I am here to represent you, so if there are any issues that concern you, please contact me. If I am not aware of an issue, I am not able to solve it.

Change of allegiance

One of the Conservative members has become an Independent, and so the distribution of membership is now: 14 Conservatives, 13 Lib Dems, and 1 Independent. We shall see how this affects decision-making within the Council, but it could be significant.

Waste collection

The working party on waste collection has made recommendations to the Operational Services Committee that will be discussed at its meeting at the end of September, and it could mean a weekly black bin (smaller than the other two bins in order to encourage re-cycling) to replace black sacks, and a weekly food waste collection in smaller bins.

Take Charge and Be Safe!

Over the last year or so, Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service has seen an increase in fires involving lithium-ion batteries. E-bikes, e-scooters, mobile phones, laptops, game console controllers, cordless tools and garden machinery, all use lithium-ion batteries that can heat up and catch fire if not used correctly.

Keep safe by following our top tips for charging safety:

- Charge batteries when you are awake and alert
- Do not charge e-bikes and e-scooters in escape routes
- Only use the battery, charger and cables supplied by the manufacturer
- Before you go to bed, check anything still charging is switched off
- Do not overload sockets.

Lithium-ion batteries can't be disposed of in your regular household recycling. Doing so can cause fires, either in the refuse vehicles or at the waste processing centres.

- Never put any kind of battery in with your household rubbish or recycling!
- Any kind of battery can cause a fire if not disposed of correctly and safely. This includes vapes or other e-cigarettes as well as standard batteries.
- Fires involving batteries cause damage to refuse vehicles and roads, as well as significant delays to bin collections and road closures.
