KNIT & NATTER

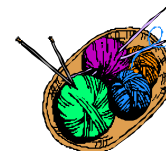
Every Monday from 1:30 to 3.30pm

BRINKLEY PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council represents everyone in the village at a local level and also manages various amenities such as the children's playpark. Parish Councils are elected bodies and play a small but important part in the UK democratic process. Whilst we have few direct powers to affect the larger scale issues, we are consulted by the authorities that are making these sorts of decisions and so we are a key conduit to ensure residents' wishes and concerns are raised with the right people. We are also able to access various grants to help improve the village.

We have meetings every three months or so which are open to the public. They are announced in advance on the village noticeboard and the website. At the start of each meeting there is an opportunity for residents to raise any issues that are important to them. Representatives from the District and County councils will also be present to hear what you say. Briefly, the main points discussed at the last meeting in September were:

- The planning applications for Kingsway Solar Farm and Willingham Green Stud. The Kingsway Action Group had requested a donation to help produce some publicity banners and this was agreed to reflect the strong views in the village.
- The District/County reorganisation - there is a question as to whether Brinkley will be grouped with Cambridge or Fenland/Peterborough.
- Highways - an improved system for reporting issues will be going live.
- Allotments - the purchase of the land is complete; plots are available.
- Street furniture - the village sign and post box were repainted and the white village gates will be attended to next.

We are always eager to hear about issues affecting anyone in the village and would welcome more engagement from residents and would especially be pleased to hear from anyone wishing to become a Parish Councillor. Stay fire safe in your kitchen

More than half the fires crews attend in the home start in the kitchen. This can be down to a number of things.

Below are some simple safety tips to help you stay fire safe in the kitchen:

- Avoid leaving children in the kitchen alone when cooking on the hob. Keep matches and saucepan handles out of their reach to keep them safe.
- Take care if you're wearing loose clothing - this can easily catch fire.
- Keep tea towels and cloths away from the cooker and hob.
- Double check the cooker is off when you've finished cooking.
- Don't store items on top of hobs.
- Take care if you need to leave the kitchen whilst cooking, take pans off the heat or turn them down to avoid risk.
- Make sure saucepan handles don't stick out - so they don't get knocked off the stove.
- Keep electrics (leads and appliances) away from water.
- Check toasters are clean and placed away from curtains and kitchen rolls.
- Keep the oven, hob and grill clean and in good working order. A build-up of fat and grease can ignite a fire.

Come along to one of our Older Driver Workshops

We are hosting a series of Older Driver Workshops throughout October and November. These are free sessions designed for those over 65 and currently driving, to help them keep driving safely for longer. We discuss how driving can become more challenging as we get older, and what simple checks we can do at home to keep ourselves fit to drive.

This interactive, two-hour session covers the following topics:

- Age-related changes when driving
- Eyesight and driving
- Conducting a vehicle check
- Licence renewal
- Signs to be aware of
- Alternatives to driving.

Get your chimney swept and keep your home fire safe!

The Service attends around 50 fires a year involving chimneys, most of which could be avoided by following some simple safety tips:

- Appoint a skilled and technically competent chimney engineer. To find your nearest local HETAS Approved Chimney Sweep visit: <https://www.hetas.co.uk/find-chimney-sweep/>

- Keep the flue shafts clear and ensure they are well maintained
- Only use properly treated wood to build a fire
- Always use a fireguard to protect against flying sparks from hot embers
- Make sure embers are properly put out before you go to bed.

We always advise getting your chimney swept at least once a year, preferably before lighting it for the first time when the cold weather arrives. There could be a buildup of debris that's accumulated over the year, which can be set alight when heating the home and could cause a significant fire.

Some will also be looking at using a chimney for the first time, that may not have been used for many years. It is really important to make sure it is swept and inspect the brickwork before lighting it for the first time.

Help your local community - become an on-call firefighter!

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is looking to recruit more on-call firefighters to help local communities by responding to emergencies.

On-call firefighters are a vital part of your fire and rescue service. They respond to a wide range of incidents, from fighting fires and attending road traffic collisions to rescuing people and animals in need. They also respond to medical emergencies.

In addition to responding to emergency incidents, on-call firefighters support their communities by providing a range of safety advice helping people to keep safe in their homes.

Being an on-call firefighter has many benefits. As well as being paid an annual wage and for the time spent at incidents or training, there are also opportunities to develop first aid skills and heavy goods vehicle driving qualifications.

County Councillor for the Woodditton division

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION

The development of proposals for new 'unitary' authorities is ongoing. Your district councillors John Trapp and Charlotte Cane have shared a link to the county council survey, which sets out the case for the preferred option of the County Council and all our local parishes. Please offer your feedback for this option to help us together fight for the best outcome.

Interestingly, fresh analysis from Westminster shows replacing the 21 two-tier systems across the country with 58 new unitary councils with populations as low as 300,000 could end up costing £850 million over five years and deliver no long-term savings. If they stick to 500,000 populations, this will hopefully favour the preferred local option.

ADULTS & HEALTH

Cambridge Children's Hospital contractor appointed.

A building contractor has been appointed to Cambridge Children's Hospital, which will be built on the same site that houses Addenbrooke's and Royal Papworth hospitals. Bouygues UK is expected to start within the next 18 months.

'Good' rating for adult social care services

Cambridgeshire County Council's adult social care services have been rated as 'Good' by the Care Quality Commission (CQC), with its assessment finding that early support and flexible options are helping people stay independent longer.

HIGHWAYS & TRANSPORT

New highways system to go live in September

The County Council's new system goes live on Monday 22 September. The current system will be taken offline on Thursday 18 September.

The new system should vastly change the experience of its predecessor and will give more transparency of; reported issues, work ordered and will retain issues through to satisfactory completion of quality checks.

This is going live shortly after a re-structure of the highway's maintenance teams, designed to deliver a more effective service for all. Having met this new team and sharing all the local issues known to me, I am confident we will start to see far improved outcomes across our area.

Local works

Since becoming your County Councillor in May, I have worked hard to resolve many highways issues that had been neglected for years. I'm delighted that my intervention has led to the road between the Kings Head and Eagle Lane in Dullingham, finally, being resurfaced between 6-8 October, weather dependent. I will continue to work with our officers to resolve other issues.

KINGSWAY SOLAR

As many will all be aware the Statutory Consultation on Kingsway will be starting imminently. #### **District Council Report - Woodditton Ward**

##### **Highways**

The repairs to the B1061 on the hill coming out of Dullingham have been brought forward in the programme to be done this year. The work is due to start on 6<sup>th</sup> October and this is very welcome, but it does blow out of the water that the decisions have been made on data obtained on all of the roads in Cambridgeshire, rather than the whims of Highways Officers.

I am very pleased that officers in the Highways Department have finally listened to my complaints over the last two years about the lack of maintenance on this road, as it has been reduced to a very dangerous level.

If there is any work that you believe requires work, please contact me and I will raise this with Highways and try to get it done.

##### **Council Reorganisation**

As mentioned last month, the response to the Government's imposed Council reorganisation continues to develop.

There are four options currently being worked on.

This new proposal was being discussed by a Full Council meeting of Peterborough City Council on 23<sup>rd</sup> July and Peterborough are pressing ahead with this proposal.

A lot of the work being done is not around the best geographical fit, but financial and operational considerations, due to the heavy debts that some Councils have.

It should be about what is best for delivering quality services to residents.

I will continue to keep you updated, but welcome and feedback or comments.

##### **Kingsway Solar**

The statutory consultation has started and will run until the end of October, so please give your views and attend one of the public engagement meetings. I will post those details on my Councillor Facebook page so please take the opportunity to visit that page for further information.

##### **Waste Services**

I have updated previously about the new waste collection service.

This will commence on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2026 and will involve a black bin instead of the black sack collection and a food caddy, which will be collected weekly, for all food waste.

Full details are being sent to every resident and I will place those details on my Councillor Facebook page, so please visit that.

REPORT FROM CHARLOTTE CANE MP

I've been working hard both in Westminster and across Ely and East Cambridgeshire to champion the issues that matter most to our communities.

One of the biggest concerns I continue to hear about is poor broadband and mobile signal. I raised this directly with Minister Chris Bryant and the Chair of Building Digital UK, sharing your frustrations and concerns about the conduct of contractors working on Project Gigabit. I've secured a commitment from BDUK to investigate, and I'll be following up to ensure your voices are heard.

Transport remains another key issue. I've joined fellow Lib Dem MPs in calling for a freeze on rail fares. With services often delayed or cancelled, it's simply not fair to ask commuters to pay more. A fare freeze would be a step towards a more reliable, affordable rail network.

In Parliament, I've spoken up for families and children in several important debates. I called for better support for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), and urged the Government to reverse cuts to the Adoption and Special Guardianship Support Fund. These are lifelines for many families in our area, and I'll keep pushing for long-term certainty and fairness.

I also led a debate on supporting neurodivergent people into work. I shared inspiring examples from our local schools and businesses that are already making a difference. Everyone deserves the opportunity to thrive, and I've asked the Government to update its guidance so that disclosure and support reflect real-world experiences.

Closer to home, I joined Cambridgeshire's Rural Crime Action Team on shift during Rural Crime Action Week. It was a valuable insight into the challenges they face, and I've called for more funding so they can provide a 24-hour service to keep our rural communities safe.

I've also been advocating for our environment. I visited the dried-up River Snail with Cllr Yannifer Malinowski and raised the issue of chalk stream protection in Parliament. These unique waterways are vital to our biodiversity, and I'll continue pressing for action. I also challenged the Prime Minister to commit to a Land Use Framework—something that would help balance the needs of farming, housing, energy, and nature.

Supporting our local economy is another priority. I visited Cambridge's Biomedical Campus to hear about their expansion plans and the infrastructure improvements needed to support growth. I also visited a local sugar beet farm to discuss the future of British farming, and visited the East Anglian Air Ambulance to learn more about their vital work.

My team and I have now closed over 7,400 cases where constituents have asked me for help, information or advice, and we're always here if you need support. Constituents are warmly welcomed to book a slot with me at an upcoming surgery, booking online here <https://bit.ly/bookasurgery> or by getting in touch using the details below.

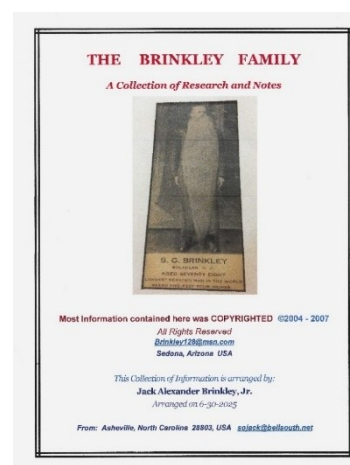
